

Message From the President—Leanne Huvenaars

The SDHA is a unique organization. We function both as the regulatory body and professional association for dental hygiene in Saskatchewan. First and foremost, it is our responsibility to be accountable to the public. Their safety is our number one priority. Secondly, we are accountable to the members of the SDHA: registered dental hygienists themselves. The government of Saskatchewan mandates this through the Dental Disciplines Act.

The SDHA Council is made up of 6 Dental Hygienists, 3 public representatives, and a representative from SK Polytechnic (formerly SIAST). We are supported by the Executive Director, Kellie Watson, a governance coach, Susan Rogers and a minute taker/support staff, Karen MacDonald. We meet three weekends per year. On the Saturday of meeting weekends, working committees meet and education sessions occur, and on the Sunday, the full council meeting.

The SDHA council has been busy at the meeting table, on working groups, as well as through teleconference to ensure that we are doing the best work for the public and you the members.

This past year the SDHA Council worked hard to formulate new Administrative Bylaws, that were approved by government in December 2014. They can be viewed on the SDHA website under the Legislation and Resources tab at www.sdha.ca. We continue to review our policies and revise them as needed.

Currency, continuing competency and the Personal Learning (PL) Tools were hot topics this year. Concerns from the members regarding the PL Tool process were expressed at the last AGM and changes were made as a result. The PL Tool form has been streamlined, and 5 continuing competency credits will be granted each 3-year period towards reflection and completion of the PL Tool forms. This took effect in January 2015.

When researching continuing competency and quality assurance, as well as the feedback we received from members, the SDHA Council felt that in order to ensure ongoing competency throughout one's career and safety for the public, additional measures were needed. As a result, we will be introducing an Ethics and Jurisprudence course requirement. Because it will take time to formulate and educate members on, this course will be implemented within the next 2-3 years. Saskatchewan dental hygienists will need to complete one course in each 3-year CCP reporting period. The continuing competency working group looked at many options. We used the information provided to us from you the members from last years 2 AGM's, and reviewed best practices in health professions across Canada. Practice hours, examinations, portfolios, and a combination of these were considered. We felt the change in the PLT and the Ethics & Jurisprudence course best suited our province and the stakeholders.

Message From the Registrar-Executive Director - Kellie Watson

It is my pleasure to hold the position of Registrar-Executive Director. I am committed to upholding the standards of the dental hygiene profession, and am passionate about working collaboratively to improve the oral and overall health of the people of Saskatchewan, and advance the dental hygiene profession in Canada.

I would like to acknowledge the efforts and contributions of volunteers, committee members, the SDHA Council and a very dedicated staff who are committed to this organization. Together we strive to exceed expectations and fulfill our responsibilities as a self-regulating profession.

REGULATING THE PROFESSION:

National Examination


Successful completion of the National Dental Hygiene Certification Examination is required for registration with the SDHA. The examination is offered three times each year in sites across Canada. The SDHA is a voting member on the National Dental Hygiene Examining Board (NDHCB) with me serving as President for the past three years.

For many reasons, it was felt that moving the license renewal period away from the holiday season/January and in order to better align with CDHA, a change to the license year-end needed to occur. This change will take effect in October 2015, and license fees were prorated for January 2015 to respect the 10 month license period.

Regulatory Bylaws were revised this year to reflect the changes in the annual license year. As well, SDHA Competencies guidelines to support the CDHA National Standards was developed, and reference to these documents were made in the Bylaws.

CONTINUING COMPETENCE PROGRAM

A mandatory continuing competence program (CCP) is in place whereby each regulated member must meet the program requirements as expressed in the CCP Guidelines. A member must earn 50 CCP credits and complete a CPR course in a three-year reporting period. When a member fails to meet the CCP requirements, application for license renewal is denied.

Message From the Registrar-Executive Director - Kellie Watson

REGULATED MEMBER STATISTICS

- Twenty five (25) individuals did not renew their dental hygiene license by January 15, 2015 and were stricken from the register. Some informed us they would not be renewing and thus were cancelled in good standing.
- Ten (10) conditional licences were issued since January 2015. Conditional status refers to someone not entitled to administer Local Anaesthetic (LA). Conditional registrants are granted two years from initial registration date to obtain their LA credential.
- Since January 2015, 31 new dental hygienists registered and licenced in Saskatchewan of which 24 were recent graduates. Of the recent graduates, 17 were from the 2015 class of dental hygiene at SK Polytechnic (formerly SIAST).
- One (1) application for registration and licensure was denied due to the applicant submitting a fraudulent application. The applicant did not disclose that she had been registered in another jurisdiction where her license was cancelled.
- No candidate accessed the Dental Hygiene Re-entry Course operated by SK Polytechnic.

REVIEWS BY COUNCIL

Council reviewed an appeal submitted by the individual that was denied registration/licensure. Council determined from the review to uphold the initial decision to deny registration.

COMPLAINTS & DISCIPLINE

The SDHA manages complaints, investigations and discipline processes in accordance with the Dental Disciplines Act and responds to written complaints about the practice or conduct of regulated members from all sources - members of the public, members of other health professions, employers, and members of the SDHA.

The complaint received this year was from a patient, unhappy with the care she had received. Consultation with the complainant, the dentist, and the dental hygienist occurred, and an explanation requested as to the details of the appointment. The complaint was resolved informally at this point and referral to the

Professional Conduct Committee was not required.

ACCESS & ADVANCEMENT

FACILITATING CONTINUING COMPETENCE

The SDHA has committed to ensuring that members have opportunities for quality, relevant professional development. A number of activities were undertaken this year to fulfill this commitment, including our involvement in the planning of the September SK Oral Professions Conference.

THE SDHA CONFERENCE AND 45th ANNIVERSARY

The SDHA held a very successful inaugural continuing competency event in Saskatoon, April 17 & 18, 2015. The event included scientific sessions and workshops that provided information to support dental hygiene practice in a variety of practice settings. In addition to the sessions, a 45th Anniversary wine & cheese event was held to not only celebrate the SDHA"s 45th anniversary, but also to recognize and acknowledge those dental hygienists reaching significant milestones in their career: 30, 35, 40, 45, and 50 years in the profession of dental hygiene. The conference and celebrations were so well received, plans are underway for the 2016 event on April 15 & 16 in Regina.

NEWSLETTER

Three editions of The SDHA Edge newsletter were published and distributed to the members. The newsletter continues to provide information about dental hygiene practice, health promotion, legislative and other educational topics.

HEALTH PROMOTION

To coincide with Halloween and Oral Health Month, the SDHA was invited to speak on Global News televised segments on oral health topics.

A full-page newspaper feature in both the Regina Leader Post and Saskatoon Star Phoenix was published during National Dental Hygienists Week discussing topics relating to oral and systemic health.

Oral health supplies continue to be donated to vulnerable population groups throughout SK.

SDHA WEBSITE

The SDHA website was upgraded in 2013/14 to allow online renewal, registration for CE events, as well as making available current CCP Transcripts. A job board continues to be a highlight on the Career tab that successfully connects dental hygienists with potential employers. More resources and guidelines are intended for 2016.

Message From the Registrar-Executive Director - Kellie Watson

MEETNGS & ACTIVITIES

The following is a summary of the Registrar-Executive Directors activities in this fiscal year.

- Represented the SDHA on the National Dental Hygiene Certification Board (NDHCB) and attended the NDHCB meetings throughout the year. Served as President of the Board of Governors from 2011 to 2015.
- Represented the SDHA at the Federation of Dental Hygiene Regulatory Authorities (FDHRA) meetings: Moncton in October 2014, and Vancouver in June 2015, and holds the position of Treasurer for this group.
- Represented the SDHA at the provincial Network of Interdisciplinary Organizations (NIRO) meetings held in fall and spring annually.
- Represented the SDHA on the Dental Hygiene Program Advisory Committee to SK Polytechnic (PAC). Annual meetings are held in November.
- The SDHA has hosted meetings of Saskatchewan Health and the other Oral Health Professions group to discuss legislative issues and the development of a collaborative model for care in underserved populations, such as long-term care facilities.
- Serves on the SK Oral Health Coalition Leadership Team with meetings occurring bi-annually.
- Serves on the Maternal & Child Oral Health Project Committee.
- Member of the Saskatchewan Tobacco Reduction Coalition; committee on Tobacco Cessation planned an inter-disciplinary professional development event on Tobacco Cessation in January 2015.
- Provide presentations to first and second year SK Polytechnic (formerly SIAST) students each year to educate them regarding the profession of dental hygiene, the SDHA and regulatory matters that affect dental hygiene practice.

It is my priority to foster good relations with the other health professions in Saskatchewan. The Saskatchewan Oral Health Professions Conference was held in Saskatoon on September 11 to 13, 2014, and was an excellent venue for our professional associations to collaborate on a scientific and social level. The 2015 session will be held September 10-12, 2015 in Regina.

Collaboration continues to strengthen our organization; with the CDHA, sister dental hygiene regulatory bodies across Canada and with other health professions within SK.

One of our major priorities remains the development of a Memorandum of Understanding with the other Oral Health Professions. With the help of Saskatchewan Health, we are discussing and coming to a mutual understanding on some of the contentious issues within the Dental Disciplines Act that currently create some confusion and/or challenges for members of each organization. This work is still underway.

Over the past year the College of Dental Surgeons and the SDHA developed a shared message on appropriate dental hygiene billing. A Communique and professional development seminar was presented in the fall of 2014 to educate both dentists and dental hygienists on how dental hygiene service codes should be used. A session on Ethics, Jurisprudence and Dental Hygiene Billing was also offered at the SDHA Conference in April 2015.

We continue to work very closely with Public Health, the other Oral Health Professions and the University of Saskatchewan, Faculty of Dentistry to develop a model for long-term care, with the end goal being to provide oral care services to those individuals residing in these homes. Addressing the oral health needs in this, and other underserved populations is a major focus of the association.

We were also proud to be actively involved in a Maternal & Child Health project created by the SK Prevention Institute that aimed at targeting pregnant women to educate them on the importance of oral health for them and their babies.

1. Meeting to Order at 1:05 p.m.

Welcome and Introduction of SDHA Council and staff. Noted that two Public Rep positions are currently vacant and we are waiting for SK Gov't to appoint. Introduction of Ondina Love, CDHA Executive Director and Mary Bertone, CDHA President.

- 2. Appointment of Parliamentarian: Karen MacDonald
- **3. Agenda:** Motion: That the September 2014 AGM Agenda be accepted as presented. Donna Gessner / Rebecca Whitrow*Carried*.

5. Council Report: Leanne Huvenaars, President

Leanne summarized her President's report highlighting the May SDHA AGM in Regina and that the NDHCB attended our meeting. 6. Registrar - Executive Director Report: Kellie Watson

She briefly described her role with the SDHA as regulating in nature and that of the Members Services rep, Chris Gordon, which includes resources, employment and practice needs for members. She summarized and spoke to several items within her report.

7. Financial Report for 2013-2014: Janel Parkinson, Vice-President

Janel presented the Audited Financial Statements with the fiscal year ending June 2014. No questions. Motion: That the financial statements be accepted as presented. Laurie Taylor / Jacqueline Desgagne Carried.

8. Official Representative Reports

CDHA: CDHA Executive Director, Ondina Love and CDHA President, Mary Bertone presented on the current programs and services of the CDHA.

Program Advisor Committee (PAC): Chris Gordon. This committee meets once per year to discuss the accredited Dental Hygiene program in Saskatchewan delivered through SIAST. The program will be going to a 6 -semester program. Diane Moore is our SDHA SIAST Council Rep.

Professional Conduct Committee: Kellie Watson. Kellie reported that two formal complaints had been received in 2013/2014. One was received from a dental practice and involved a dental hygienist's acquisition of patient contact information and the contacting of these patients when the member had left the practice. This complaint was resolved informally with no misconduct identified. The second complaint was received by a patient unhappy with the care he has received. This was also resolved with no misconduct identified.

SDHA Going Green: Kellie Watson. In an attempt to use less paper and postage, we will not be mailing an annual transcript to each member. These are now available to view and print on-line. As well, fewer newsletters and brochures will be printed and mailed, as we now have on-line registration for courses and meetings.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

JUNE 30, 2015

(Unaudited)

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

The Saskatchewan Dental Hygienists Association is the regulatory body over Registered Dental Hygienists in the province of Saskatchewan and is mandated by the provincial government, under *The Dental Disciplines Act*, to carry out its activities and govern its members in a manner that serves and protects the public interest.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations (ASNFPO) and include the following significant accounting policies:

Financial instruments

Measurement of financial instruments

The Association initially measures its financial assets and liabilities at fair value.

The Association subsequently measures all its financial assets and financial liabilities at amortized cost, except for investments in equity instruments that are quoted in an active market, which are measured at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognized in the statement of operations.

Financial assets measured at amortized cost include cash, term deposits and GIC's and accrued interest receivable.

Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost include accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

Impairment

Financial assets measured at cost are tested for impairment when there are indicators of impairment. The amount of the write-down is recognized in the statement of operations. The previously recognized impairment loss may be reversed to the extent of the improvement, directly or by adjusting the allowance account, provided it is no greater than the amount that would have been reported at the date of the reversal had the impairment not been recognized previously. The amount of the reversal is recognized in the statement of operations.

Risks and concentrations

The Association as part of its operations carries a number of financial instruments. It is management's opinion that the Association is not exposed to significant interest or credit risks arising from these financial instruments.

Property and equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on the diminishing balance basis over the estimated useful life of the assets at the following annual rates:

Office equipment 20% Computer 45%

In the year of acquisition, amortization is provided for using one-half the annual rate.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued:

Contributed surplus

Volunteers contribute an undefined number of hours to assist the Association in carrying out its activities. Because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

Revenue recognition

The Saskatchewan Dental Hygienists Association follows the deferral method of accounting for licensing revenue received from its members. Licensing revenue is recognized in the period that the related member services are expensed.

Income taxes

No provision has been made for income taxes as none of the activities carried on by the Association are subject to income taxes.

Measurement uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian ASNFPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the period. Assumptions underlying deferred cost valuations are limited by the availability of reliable comparable data and the uncertainty concerning future events.

By nature, asset valuations are subjective and do not necessarily result in precise determinations. Should underlying assumptions change, the estimated net recoverable amount could change by a material amount.
